Community Reporting Tool

When people experience racism or another type of discrimination, sometimes they may not know what to do next.

Whether they want to make a complaint or just report something they've experienced, the Community Reporting Tool, developed by the Victorian Equal Opportunity and Human Rights Commission, is a quick and easy way for community members to report something that has happened to them or seek further information about their rights.



Hosting the Community Reporting Tool

We know that community organisations and local councils play a central role in supporting local communities. If people in your area experience racism, discrimination, hate speech or religious vilification, hosting the Community Reporting Tool on your website is a simple way you can help them exercise their rights and seek further help.

How it works


The Community Reporting Tool is a standalone widget that can be added directly to other organisations' websites. To make a report, community members enter a simple description of the racism, discrimination or other human rights issues they've experienced or witnessed. Their report is sent securely and confidentially to the Victorian Equal Opportunity and Human Rights Commission.

How it helps the community

We understand that a formal process of making a complaint can be intimidating for some people. The Community Reporting Tool allows people to make a report without having to go through a formal process. When they complete the report, they can choose whether they receive further contact from the Commission – if they want more information, we can help them understand their rights under Victoria's anti-discrimination laws and how they can make a complaint using our free, fair and timely complaints service.

How reports are used

Knowing the types of racism and discrimination Victorians are experiencing in the community is vital for the Commission's work. We use de-identified information from reports to advocate for stronger protections of peoples' rights and to enhance our enquiry and complaint services so they best meet the needs of Victorians.

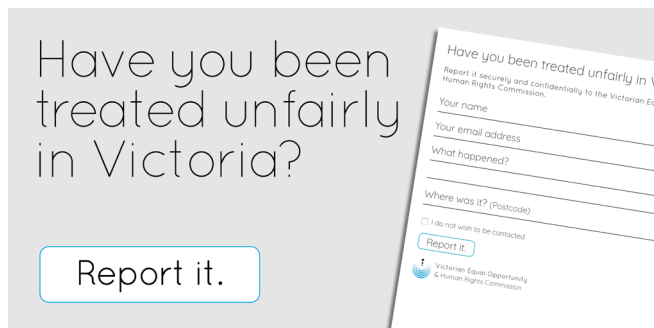
